

>>> LOCKS

On the Petite Saône, most locks are automatic and very easy to operate by means of a pole located upstream or downstream on the waterway.

WHEN PASSING THOUGH A LOCK.

- life jackets are compulsory for all persons on the deck
- children under 16 must remain inside the boat
- in addition to the compulsory lifejacket, anyone handling mooring lines should wear gloves to avoid rope burns
- the boat's engine must be running and in neutral (out of gear)
- never block a mooring line during the lock crossing: lines must be allowed to slide freely

Never park the boat in a lock.



>> HOW TO USE THE POLE

Pull up to the pole slowly and give it a quarter-turn. The orange light will start blinking to confirm your request is queued.

Wait for the green light as long as it takes before entering the lock.

Do not pull or hang on to the pole, as you may damage it.





>>> SPECIAL PASSAGES

Savoyeux tunnel Saint Albin tunnel Lifejackets are compulsory when passing through tunnels and the boat's navigation lights must be turned on.



Keep an electric hand lamp handy.
